

Parish Pilgrimage in 2020?

Fr Allan is exploring the possibility of organising a trip in 2020, here's some of the initial dialogue.

Our parish is under the patronage of St Gregory Barbarigo, a somewhat obscure Italian prelate. He was born in Venice, trained and worked in Rome (nephew of the Pope). He was made bishop of Bergamo and then Padua. A list of places in Italy that would make for an interesting pilgrimage, I believe. Leaving aside Rome, having a central location such as Padua might make it feasible to visit the other two places without too much discomfort. The Roman option I would take advice on the feasibility of it without making the costs astronomical. A side trip to Milan for St Charles Borromeo might interest some in my other church. Regarding the flights, the best option seems to be to fly to Venice from Edinburgh. There are no direct flights from Glasgow. Obviously the times are not yet open for 2020 but the current timetable shows an outgoing Jet2Com flight at 0745 arriving in Venice at 1130. This would give the group more time on that day but would be an early start. The other option is an Easyjet flight departing Edinburgh at 1510 but that does not land until 1855, so you would arrive at the hotel quite late. Anyway, all to think about.

GOING INTO HOSPITAL?

If you wish to see a Catholic Chaplain during your stay in hospital, you need to ask the hospital staff to contact him. There is always a priest on call for emergencies, but staff will not page the priest unless asked by patients or families. Patient's Religious Declaration, which a person when admitted to hospital, or a relative/friend, should give to ward-staff to ensure they can see a Catholic Chaplain. This can also be achieved through a verbal-request to staff. This is necessary due to the way confidentiality rules are applied in most hospitals.
