#### GOING INTO HOSPITAL?

If you wish to see a Catholic Chaplain during your stay in hospital, you need to ask the hospital staff to contact him. There is always a priest on call for emergencies, but staff will not page the priest unless asked by patients or families. Patient's Religious Declaration, which a person when admitted to hospital, or a relative/friend, should give to ward-staff to ensure they can see a Catholic Chaplain. This can also be achieved through a verbal-request to staff.

This is necessary due to the way confidentiality rules are applied in most hospitals.

Possibly 5/7 days with flight from Edinburgh. There is no final itinerary or price as yet, but we would like to know how many people would likely be interested on going on this trip.

VENICE. 1). The Palazzo Barbarigo Minotto (also called Palazzo Minotto Barbarigo) is a 15th-century palace on the Grand Canal in Venice, northern Italy, next to the much larger Palazzo Corner.[1] Built in the Venetian Gothic style, it was originally two palaces, Palazzo Barbarigo and Palazzo Minotto, later joined together. The Barbarigo palace was owned by the Barbarigo family for several centuries and was the birthplace of Gregorio Barbarigo.,2) The Chiesa di Santa Maria del Giglio is a church in Venice, Italy. Giovanni Maria Morlaiter has an additional sculpture found in the second chapel to the right of San Gregorio Barbarigo. ...3) St Mark's Cathedral, Venice, possibly where he was ordained. BERGAMO. 4) The Cathedral and 5) The Seminary: PADUA. 6) The Cathedral (where St Gregory's remains are) and 7) THE BASILICA OF ST ANTHONY (8) The SEMINARY.... 9) MILAN A side trip to Milan where St Charles Borromeo was Archbishop of Milan from 1564 to 1584 and a Cardinal.
