

Safeguarding Training

This is to inform that additional dates have been added to the Safeguarding Training Calendar, giving more opportunities to attend Safeguarding Induction Part 1 locally. This Safeguarding Induction is aimed to new volunteers and all those existing volunteers who still need to complete this training by the deadline of 31st October 2018 (as per our previous memos dated 9th May, 8th August and 19th September 2018). Our records show there are over 500 volunteers who still require to attend this training. **If they have not attended by the deadline they will unfortunately be unable to continue in their voluntary role with children/protected adults until they have attended Safeguarding Induction Part 1.**

GOING INTO HOSPITAL? If you wish to see a Catholic Chaplain during your stay in hospital, you need to ask the hospital staff to contact him. There is always a priest on call for emergencies, but staff will not page the priest unless asked by patients or families. Patient's Religious Declaration, which a person when admitted to hospital, or a relative/friend, should give to ward-staff to ensure they can see a Catholic Chaplain. This can also be achieved through a verbal-request to staff. This is necessary due to the way confidentiality rules are applied in most hospitals.

St Gregory Barbarigo Parish, Glasgow Pilgrimage to Italy 2020 Itinerary

Day One – Monday 20th April 2020 -Our departure will be from Edinburgh Airport to Venice where we will meet our bus and be taken to our 3* hotel in Padua. After checking in we are free to have a stroll in this beautiful town. We meet again for dinner.

Day two – Tuesday, 21st April 2020 -After breakfast we leave the hotel for a whole day tour of Padua stopping first at the Cathedral where St Gregory's remains are interred. Here we celebrate Mass. We then move on to the Basilica of St Anthony where we can see all the stunning Renaissance artwork in the chapels and visit the relics of St Anthony which reside here. We break for lunch before going on to visit the Cappella degli Scrovegni which houses Giotto's frescoes telling the story of Christ from the Annunciation to Ascension. We are then free to enjoy Padua before meeting again for dinner. Our overnight accommodation is in our hotel.

Day three – Wednesday, 22nd April 2020 -After breakfast the group travel to Bergamo. Here we visit the Cathedral, dedicated to the Assumption of Mary. We move on to the Seminary where we celebrate Mass. We break for lunch and the early afternoon is free to explore Bergamo. We leave late afternoon to drive to Verona where you might like to visit Juliet's balcony and enjoy a drink before have dinner in a local restaurant after which we return to our hotel in Padua.

Day four – Thursday, 23rd April 2020 After breakfast we leave for a whole day in Venice. We visit Palazzo Minotto Barbarigo, a 15th century palace on the Grand Canal which was the birthplace of Gregorio Barbarigo. We move on to the church of Santa Maria del Giglio where we will celebrate Mass. We break for lunch before visiting the famous Cathedral of San Marco where St Gregory was ordained. The rest of the afternoon is free to enjoy beautiful Venice. We return to Padua for dinner and overnight accommodation in our hotel.

Day five – Friday, 24th April 2020 After breakfast we check out of the hotel and the make our way to the airport for our return flight to the Edinburgh.

Price: £1,040 per person sharing a twin/double room on a half board basis. Single rooms are available at a supplement of £145. Price includes return airfare including hold baggage, accommodation as detailed in the itinerary, all transport whilst in Italy, services of professional guides, gratuities and all entrance fees.
